First aid for dogs

Knowing the first thing to do to help your dog in an emergency situation can help you stay calm and could save his life. Even having an understanding of how to care for minor injuries can help aid recovery in the long term. However, it is vital that you always seek veterinary attention if your dog ever runs into trouble.

When should first aid be used?

Immediately after an accident or sudden illness it is best to take your pet to the veterinary surgery than to call a vet out.

Being Prepared

- **Vets-** It is best to use your own vets who will have a full medical history for your pet. If you are on holiday always note down the name and number of vets in the area.
- Phone the vets first to let them know you are coming.
- **Pen and paper-** To note down any instructions/ directions
- **Collar and tag +/- microchip**
- **Water**
- **First aid kit**
 - Solution to clean a wound- iodine (dilute this in water)/ salt water
 - Bandaging (Non adhesive dressing, soft dressing e.g. cotton wool, conforming bandage, vetwrap, micropore tape, swabs)
 - Scissors/ tweezers
 - Sterile saline eye flush
 - Gloves
 - Thermometer
 - Blanket/ foil wrap
 - Muzzle (can use bandage)
 - Large blanket (stretcher/ warmth)

First things to do in an emergency

- Stay calm and assess the situation before acting
- Any dog in pain/ shock has the potential to bite
- **Triage**
 - ❖ *Assess mental status*
 - Bright, alert and reactive
 - Quiet, alert and reactive
 - Stupor
 - Coma

- ❖ *A- Airway* – is the airway clear?
- ❖ *B- Breathing*- Watch for chest movements.7
 - The Respiratory rate should be between 12-24 breaths in 1 minute
 - Check the respiratory effort.
 - If your dog is panting the respiratory rate cannot be assessed.
- ❖ *C- Circulation* –
 - The heart rate should be between 70-120 beats in 1 minute.
 - Check the pulse rate
 - Check the gums
 - Colour- should be pink and moist
 - Blood refill – press your finger on the gum and let go, the colour should come back in less than 2 seconds.
 - Can your dog get up/ move?
 - Check for any bleeding
 - Temperature should be between 37.5-39 °C.
 - Transport- Don't rush/ panic when driving.
- **Ingestion of toxins**
 - ***Plants***
 - azaleas/ rhododendrons
 - tulips/ daffodils
 - ***Human medication***- Any prescription/ over the counter human medication
 - ***Rat bait***
 - ***Blue/ green algae*** (green algae on top of ponds/ lakes)
 - ***Human foods*** (chocolate, avocado, chewing gum, grapes/ raisins, macadamia nuts, alcohol)
 - Don't make your dog sick
 - Get to vets straight away.
 - Gather up any containers/ wrappers/ leaflets/ samples to take to the vets
 - Prevention- child proof containers
- **Bleeding**
 - Put pressure on area and assess if you can apply a bandage.
 - If you can apply a bandage- Firstly put a non adhesive layer on wound, then use soft bandaging material, then the conforming bandage, then vetwrap.
 - NEVER bandage too tightly, especially when using vetwrap.
 - If blood seeping through bandage just add another layer.
 - You can bathe open wounds in iodine/ salt water.
- **Trauma**
 - ***Road accidents***
 - Prevention better than cure- check collar isn't loose, keep on lead around roads.
 - Calm attitude and voice.
 - Assess for bleeding, fractures or obvious injuries
 - Go straight to the vet
 - ***Fractures***
 - Don't apply any bandage or splint.

- Use stretcher or carry if possible.
 - Address any bleeding and basic first aid.
- **Stick injury**
 - Stick injuries are common.
 - Can get bits stuck across roof of mouth, or can pierce through back of throat at high speed.
- **Dog attacks**
 - Stay calm, don't pick dog up or risk injuring yourself.
 - Can throw coats/ towels etc over dogs to stop fight
 - Go to a vet as soon as possible- bites can be bathed with iodine/ salt water first.
- **Burns and scolds**
 - Gently pour cool water across area. Try not to touch area and don't bandage.
- **Snake bite**
 - Adders only venomous snake in UK
 - Spring/ summer
 - Swelling around bite
 - Can go into shock
- **Stings**
 - Try and pull sting out if possible and bathe in salt water.
 - Not an emergency unless having a reaction (lethargy, difficulty breathing, swelling, excessive panting)
- **Hyperthermia/ heat stress**
 - Hot cars/ exercising when hot/ brachycephalic dogs/ heart or lung disease/ muzzled in heat/only on concrete/ no shade.
 - Dogs don't sweat and depend on panting to regulate body temperature.
 - Excessive panting or short sharp breaths/ bright red gums/ weakness.
 - Rectal temperature between 40- 43°C.
 - Move to air conditioned building ideal, poor cooled water over dog, use fan.
- **Seizures**
 - Stay calm, don't touch, Can bite- put cushions around furniture.
 - Time the seizure- if more than 3mins treat as an emergency.
 - Post-seizure disorientation- can still bite; this phase can last a few hours.
- **Other emergencies**
 - Straining to pass urine
 - Swollen stomach
- **CPCR**
 - Keep dog lying on side
 - Interlock hands
 - Keep arms straight
 - Pump chest to the tune of 'Staying alive' by the Bee Gees (This is the right amount of heart beats per minute)
 - No need to give breaths, chest compressions should be enough to move air in and out of the lungs.
 - Ideally get someone else to check pulse
 - Call the vet.
- **Parasites**
 - Ticks- Can use tick repellent, or tick removers.
 - Lungworm- Potentially fatal, some areas ok UK worse than others <http://www.lungworm.co.uk/>

The above information is for general information only and should never substitute a veterinary examination and/ or specific treatment. You should always contact a vet in an emergency.

Heather gave a talk about First Aid for Dogs. After we had lunch it was time to play games and enter into competitions. Sheila and Diane supervised, and I entered into the dog with the waggiest tail. I enjoyed my first Fun Day and hope we can go again next year.

In July I started my bronze, good citizen award classes. I have been to puppy foundation classes before, and, when I got used to them I enjoyed going, so I wasn't worried when Klaus told me where we were going. It was in the same village hall with Delia our teacher, she is very nice with all the dogs, and we all like her a lot. When we arrived for the first lesson I looked around at the other dogs that were already there, I was wondering if I had met any of them before. They were all new to me except Henry who is a Labrador; he was at Puppy School, and always good fun. Delia explained to us what we would be doing this time while we sat on our mats with our chewies. The classes seem to fly by, Klaus says that it's because we are concentrating, well I do some of the time, but I get distracted quite a lot. Toby if you remember was at puppy school with me and always liked to fool around a bit and have fun. Toby was taken to the end of the hall and his owner called to him to come. Toby set off quite nicely, but as he got half way along the room, noticed Delia's Toy Box and made a run towards that. Toby loves to play with toys and promptly got one out of the box and ran around the room with it. Everyone in the hall laughed which made matters worse as Toby thought he was doing a good job. The laughing encouraged Toby to do another lap of the hall shaking to toy around as he went. The examiner laughed as well, and asked if Toby could do it again. Delia explained that she would move the toy box around the corner so it was out of sight. Toby was positioned at the end of the hall again to do his recall, and his owner called him again. We all had a good time at our classes and even with my second chance at recall passed and received my certificate. So we are all going on to start the Silver award in September.

So the car was packed with some of my things and we started our journey. When we arrived Pat and Steve came out to meet us. I had a good bark as usual, I can't help it! Pat said that I would be able to run around and play with the others here, I must say that I think this is great; I only have a small garden at home so the paddock will be fun to play in. We went back to the house and whilst the others were talking I had a look around the kitchen. RÉGIONALE D'ELEVAGE,
NÉVACHE
MAY 19TH 2013

A casual remark at Crufts about the Régionale d'Élevage at Névache in May, set us thinking. We would be in France in May, we had never been to the Alps, so why not have a weekend there and enter Geordi in the show. Geordi's entry was sent off and a hotel booked with some difficulty as many of the hotels in that area were closed during May.

We left our French house on Friday 17th May for the six hour drive to Névache with some trepidation, as the weather forecast for the weekend was diabolical. Agnès Audibert had already told us that the last time the show was held in Névache it had snowed! We passed through some lovely countryside and as we approached the Alps, the views were superb. It was bright and sunny when we arrived at the hotel so we took advantage of this and took the dogs for a walk.

At dinner in the evening we sat with a delightful couple, Fabienne and Philippe, who had come from Mulhouse with their six female PSDs. All six were allowed in the hotel room! The following morning, a walk had been organised and we decided to go, as the weather was looking good.



Quite a large group of people and their dogs were gathered at the campsite for the start of the walk and we recognised one or two people. Not long into the walk it started to snow, intermittently at first but then more seriously! The path climbed quickly and steeply and at one point we had to cross a stream, which was flowing

very fast. Most of the dogs were reluctant to cross and had to be carried across. Lunch was served in a long tent, which was open along one side. The vin chaud (mulled wine) served before the meal was very welcome, as much to warm hands as to warm our insides!
